## <u>Regarding Japanese Language Courses/Subjects</u> (Fall Semester 2014 | Application Procedures for Part-time Students)

Center for Japanese Studies

Students enrolled in Keio undergraduate or graduate schools and visiting scholars of those who have a position at Keio (e.g. visiting research fellows or visiting professors) are eligible to take courses/subjects as part-time students from the Japanese Language Courses for International Center (JLCIC) or the Japanese Language Program (JLP) offered by the Center for Japanese Studies.

### 4. Credits

Credits will be awarded if requirements are fulfilled. <u>Please make sure to complete course registration even if credits are not</u> <u>needed. If you fail to register within the period for course registration, you will not be allowed to attend classes.</u>

### 5. Tuition and Study Material Fees

Depending on the faculty or graduate school, students may be exempt from tuition and study material fees. For details, please confirm at the office for your faculty/graduate school.

(Normal rates of tuition are 20,000 yen per one-credit subject and 40,000 yen per two-credit subject.)

International Exchange Students accepted by the Keio International Center:

Tuition fee and study material fee (2,000yen/subject) are waived.

International MEXT Students accepted by the Keio International Center:

Tuition fee and study material fee (2,000yen/subject) are waived for the first two semesters after coming to Japan. However, from the third semester onwards, tuition fee and study material fee must be paid as stated above.

### To students learning Japanese for the first time

Students learning Japanese for the first time must enroll in Elementary 1 courses (JLCIC). Students are required to learn hiragana before classes begin as these courses are designed on the premise that <u>all students can read and write Hiragana</u>. If you have never studied Japanese and cannot write Hiragana, <u>we ask that you study Hiragana on your own before classes</u> <u>begin</u> using the following methods and <u>make sure that you can write Hiragana before the first class starts.</u>

1) Hiragana Study Materials

Use the URL on the next page to find the link "Study Materials (Hiragana)" for self-study. We will also provide further study materials at the JLP Office after **September 1** for those who wish to study more.

2) E-learning

After you complete your online registration, we will set up the "E-learning System" for self-study. Once ready, we will inform students who are learning Japanese for the first time of the URL and their ID and password by email after **September 19**.
